## *Fall, 2007 Registration Opens for Raleigh Neighborhood College*



The Neighborhood College is a program offered by the City of Raleigh in partnership with Wake County. *The Fall, 2007 session begins September 6<sup>th</sup>* and lasts 13 weeks. Participants receive in-depth information on the services provided by City of Raleigh and Wake County governments. Students in the college will interact with City and County staff and other Raleigh residents to expand knowledge of municipal government processes and how to use this knowledge to improve your neighborhoods.
